Message from the Founder

After a year like 2020, it's easy to point to challenges and setbacks that the pandemic has brought to our lives and communities. I could certainly name a few.

Instead, I want to use this space to express gratitude for a meaningful personal milestone: 10 years.

This past year marked a decade that cancer and the foundation have been a part of my life. I was diagnosed with thyroid cancer in April 2010 as a teenager and began my journey to fight and get back to "normal" life. While I was juggling treatments and doctor visits, I was beginning another journey with Bite Me Cancer – that we would become a foundation by September to help other teenagers with all cancers feel less alone and to further important research to find a cure for thyroid cancer.

In a year that was more of a challenge to conduct fundraising with all in-person events cancelled, I wanted to share a few highlights:

As of December 31, 2020, we reached \$1,070,350 in fundraising dollars since BMC began!

We achieved our goal of distributing our signature Teen Support Bags to teens with cancer in all 50 states thanks to our growing network of hospital partners. Even with the restrictions around Covid, we were able to

ship out bags to 900 teens with cancer.

These bags were even more critical this year, as hospital visitations were restricted during the pandemic.

New volunteers joined our foundation to support our mission and help raise more funds to further our work.

Our board of directors continually managed our finances well to ensure we could sustain a decline in revenue during a tough year.

Our events team rolled with several punches during 2020, repeatedly rescheduling our Annual Wine Dinner, which we look forward to bringing back in 2021.

While 2020 didn't bring us the year we were expecting, we continued to deliver on our mission and be there for teenagers with cancer. We were able to do so because of the immense support and dedication of our volunteers, sponsors and donors.

To all our volunteers, sponsors, committees, board members, donors, research and hospital partners, and friends, I thank you for your support during the past 10 years as we continue to bring comfort to teens battling cancer in 2021 and beyond.

About Us



Bite Me Cancer is devoted to supporting teenagers with all cancers and funding meaningful research for thyroid cancer.

Bite Me Cancer is an all-volunteer nonprofit foundation in Fairfax County, Virginia, founded in September 2010 by Nikki Ferraro, five months after she was diagnosed with a rare form of Thyroid Cancer. At the time, she was 17 years old and a junior at Chantilly High School in Virginia. Nikki was determined to lead a Relay for Life team just two weeks after her diagnosis. She named the team Bite Me Cancer and experienced immediate success raising over \$20,000! When Nikki decided to create a foundation a few months later, she wanted to continue the legacy of her team's name and thus her foundation became Bite Me Cancer.

The foundation began with a small board of directors and a focus on Nikki's 2 goals: (1) to support and inspire teenagers battling all cancers through Teen Support Bags and other programs (2) to work towards new treatments

and a cure for thyroid cancer through directly funding thyroid cancer research grants.

In June 2012, after raising enough funds for 100 Teen Support Bags, Bite Me Cancer began distributing the bags to teens dealing with all cancers. The program grew quickly in numbers of bags and number of hospitals who wanted the bags. The foundation was also able to fund its first of many direct research grants in 2014.


As the foundation grew, the need for a storage space and a small office outside of the Ferraro home was needed in 2015. Currently, the foundation is in a building owned by Service Source (a national nonprofit) at a generous discounted rate and use of all conference rooms and facilities.

Bite Me Cancer continues to be an all-volunteer organization.


The beginning of Bite Me Cancer.

*Research payout amount was raised in 2018 and 2019. Research grants are each for a 2-year timeframe. Bite Me Cancer pays 1/2 at the beginning of year 1 and pays 1/2 at the beginning of year 2.

Inspiration

Teen Support Program

When Nikki was diagnosed with cancer at age 17, she realized that there was not age-specific support for teenagers as they fell between the younger pediatric groups and the adult patients. She felt strongly that a Teen Support Bag was needed that would contain age-appropriate support when battling cancer.

During 2020, our bag assembly events, and distribution of bags became delayed due to the pandemic. Eventually, we were able to distribute 900 Teen Support Bags (instead of the budgeted 1,200 bags) across the country to teenagers dealing with all cancers. The bags were shipped to our hospital partners and a few nonprofits who hand out the bags to their teen patients. We increased our hospital partners to 140 during 2020. We were able to achieve our goal to reach teens in all states (and DC) and

increased the number of states to 140. From inception in June 2012 to December 2020, Bite Me Cancer has reached almost 8,100 teenagers with cancer with our Teen Support Bag. That means 8,100 opportunities for us to help teenagers with cancer to smile, feel supported and even inspired. Many of their families have also shared their positive feedback with us.

Each Teen Support Bag costs us \$75.

Usually, we also distribute meals once/month to families battling cancer on the Pediatric/Oncology Unit of INOVA Children's Hospital. In 2020, due to Covid we only were able to deliver in January and February.



"I am 15 years old. Last year, I got sick during the pandemic and was in the hospital with many medical issues when they thought I had Covid. My family wasn't allowed to see me. I was then diagnosed with cancer. I loved your bag!

Something for teens finally! My favorite thing is the socks!"

Awareness

The sixth Teen Cancer Awareness Week was held the 3rd week of January 2020.

Bite Me Cancer is proud to have successfully achieved an annual Teen Cancer Awareness Week across the Commonwealth of Virginia during the 3rd week of January each year that began in 2014. Delegate Tom Rust and Delegate Ken Plum helped achieve a unanimous vote of the entire Virginia House of Delegates in 2013 to make this happen. This awareness week serves as a positive force for Virginia teen cancer patients. (Photo below is from 2013.)

Bite Me Cancer continues to spread awareness to the specific challenges of teenagers who battle cancer. Teenagers dealing with cancer have many unique challenges: they understand the seriousness of cancer and the possibility of death, the loss of friendships, the missing of school and activities, the increased need for parents, the loss of independence, the question around getting through middle school, high school or college, and even more.



Research

Our grants make a positive impact in fighting thyroid cancer.

When Nikki formed Bite Me Cancer, she felt strongly that thyroid cancer research needed to be a focus for the foundation since it had been the fastest increasing cancer for many years and that her rare kind of thyroid cancer had no treatment options other than surgery. In 2013, Bite Me Cancer was able to be an Alliance for Patient Education Member of the American Thyroid Association (ATA) and become a partner in their thyroid cancer research program. ATA's grant program is for younger researchers who

receive a two-year grant if their proposals are accepted after extensive reviews. Bite Me Cancer is proud to be part of this important program that funds new and innovative research.

In 2020, Bite Me Cancer raised enough funds (\$25,000) to fund 50% of our 8th thyroid cancer research grant. This grant will be appointed by June 2021 and will be in partnership with ThyCa (Thyroid Cancer Survivors Association) as they also contributed 50%. We partner in years where funds are lower than expected.
